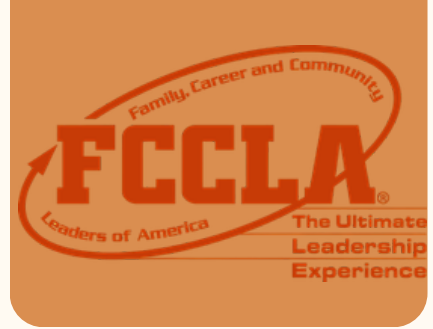


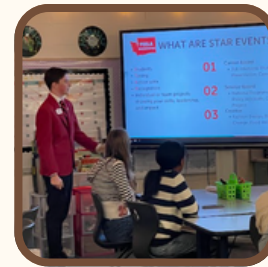

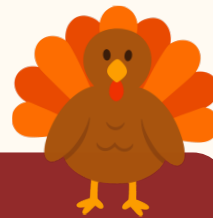
FRIENDSGIVING (FT. FFA)

FOOD BOWL

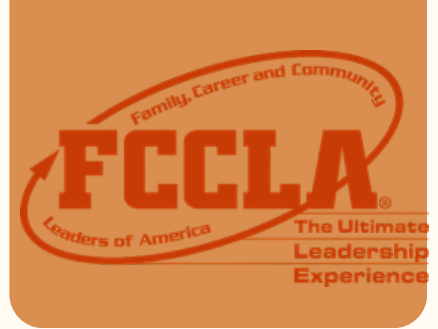
